a.) Emergency Planning: **Steve Oglesby** reported that there has been a Presidential Declaration of Disaster (PDD) made for Tennessee opening up federal funding for the 12 counties that were adversely affected by the Memorial Day weekend storms that occurred on May 27, 2017. He also stated that TEMA was working with the counties to prepare for the upcoming TVA exercise.

# Mike Higgins reported:

- D&D facilities were being taken down.
- Work on groundwater rod was ongoing
- Reindustrialization and preservation efforts continue
- EMDF proposed landfill project is in feasibility study stage
- ORNL remedial investigations are ongoing
- b.) Environmental Management: Dave Adler reported on all of the following
  - i. Y-12 (Mercury & Demolition) –Continued work toward 2020 deadline
    - a. Groundwater restoration is longer-term project
    - b. Y-12 focus on water treatment plant completion
    - c. Already beginning work towards a landfill for its phase out
    - d. Liquid mercury will not be disposed of inside Tennessee. "Quicksilver" is shipped away from TN for disposal. Only trace/residual mercury is confined and disposed of inside the state.
    - e. Have entered into a protocol or formal dispute over language disagreements within a document. Must find language that all parties can agree on.
  - ii. ORNL –Looking forward to resuming shipments of waste from Oak Ridge facilities to waste management treatment centers.
  - iii. Private groundwater sampling and analysis is ongoing

  - the K-25 History Center project at Oak Ridge Fire Station #4 is proceeding, with RFP's expected to be issued soon
  - City staff participated in the recent DOE Emergency Response Exercise
  - a recent review of DOE's proposed FY18 EM Budget shows stable funding; the Energy Communities Alliance and other intergovernmental organizations are emphasizing the need to modernize infrastructure at DOE sites
  - Explore Oak Ridge, the Roane Alliance, and the Anderson County Tourism have been busy with activities in support of ORRCA's public education and outreach scope of work. She introduced Pam May with the Roane Alliance, who provided an update of their activities.

- iv. Roane County Environmental Review Board Activities **Mary Anne Koltowich** reported on the group of citizens that have taken over the issue of the invasive weeds. There has been a board created to handle the future issues.

Subject: Rail cars at East Tennessee Technology Park

Dear Sirs:

Roane County Government has been monitoring and continues to perform visual inspection/inventory of rail cars which have been stored on the Heritage Railroad spurs owned by Energy Solutions located in the East Tennessee Technology Park.

The East Tennessee Technology Park is located in the Roane County section of the City of Oak Ridge. The park is located across the Clinch River from the subdivision development called the Preserve on the Clinch where a number of residents reside.

The following documentation expresses Roane County's concern with the rail car storage of potentially hazardous materials near State Route 58 and a newly developing subdivision "The Preserve on the Clinch" adjacent to the Clinch River, and located within an industrial park and adjacent to the new Manhattan Project National Historical Park.

The following timeline documents Roane County's concern over the rail cars and their potential hazards:

Mid-August 2016

My notes recall the first awareness of the potential hazard was mid-August 2016. To the best of my knowledge on that day I called Energy Solutions President John Christian about the county's concern of the risk posed by these rail cars.

December 1, 2016

The Roane County Environmental Review Board discussed the number of cars and the possible loads in the cars (see attached minutes).

### December 7, 2016

My calendar-reflects a meeting with Sharon Templeton and John Christian of Energy Solutions in my office.

# December 8, 2016

The presence of the rail cars and the possible hazards were discussed in the Roane County Commission Emergency Services Committee (see attached minutes).

# December 13, 2016

The Local Emergency Planning Committee discussed the need for an emergency response to an incident involving the rail cars (see attached minutes).

# December 2016

A letter was sent to Mike Lahr, Vice President, Energy Solutions from the Roane County Office of Emergency Services requesting information on the contents, quantity and future status of the rail cars (see attached).

# February 2, 2017

The Roane County Environmental Review Board discussed the rail cars (see attached minutes).

# March 2, 2017

The Roane County Environmental Review discussed the rail cars (see attached minutes).

### March 9, 2017

The Roane County Emergency Services Committee again discussed the rail cars (see attached minutes).

# March 27, 2017

The Oak Ridge Reservation Communities Alliance discussed the rail cars and their possible impact on the proposed ETTP Airport (see attached minutes).

# January 1, 2017 - March 31, 2017

Roane County employees Scott Stout and Traci Cofer's time reports documenting the rail car monitoring (see attached).

# April 6, 2017

The Roane County Environmental Review Board was updated on the rail cars (see attached minutes).

# April 20, 2017

Roane County received a copy of the EPA report indicating hazardous materials stored in the rail cars are not in compliance with DOT regulations.

Roane County is requesting your assistance in regards to the enforcement of regulations, safe storage of materials, and prompt removal of non-compliant storage contained within the rail cars currently located in the East Tennessee Technology Park. Your attention to this matter would be greatly appreciated.

Roane County will continue to work with our legal staff and legislators to remove this potential hazard.





