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TDEC GRANT SCOPE 2012-2016

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and State of Tennessee (State) have adopted a new 5-year Tennessee Oversight Agreement (TOA) to promote state and local government involvement in environmental management and emergency response planning for the Oak Ridge Reservation and environs. Local governing bodies in the vicinity of the Oak Ridge Reservation have adopted the Tennessee Oversight Interlocal Agreement (TOIA) that will serve as a framework for local government interaction with the Department of Energy and the State of Tennessee on TOA environmental management and emergency response issues related to the DOE facilities in Oak Ridge. A copy of the agreement is attached.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The City of Oak Ridge shall serve as the Grantee. The grant scope is for the provision of local government involvement and public information related to environmental restoration, waste management activities and emergency response planning on the Oak Ridge Reservation and environs.

- The Grantee shall support implementation of the attached Tennessee Oversight Interlocal Agreement (TOIA)
- 2. The Grantee shall provide all service and deliverables as required, described, and detailed in the grant contract provided by TDEC.
- The Grantee shall promote local government involvement and public awareness in the continued operations of the Oak Ridge Reservation facilities, including, but not limited to the environmental restoration process.
- The Grantee shall disseminate accurate and factual information concerning present or proposed activities related to continued operations of the Oak Ridge Reservation facilities.
- 5. The Grantee shall identify local concerns and issues relevant to the operation of the Oak Ridge Reservation and environs and present concerns to the State of Tennessee, the Department of Energy and the Department of Energy during the selection of annual work and budget priorities.
- The Grantee shall prepare special studies and reports, as needed, to educate local officials and further public information.
