FY 2020 Quarterly Report for the Period  
July 1 thru September 30, 2019

A number of activities in support of the ORRCA grant scope of work took place during this **first quarter** of the FY20 grant period.

**Q1 Activities in Support of the Scope of Services:**

- (1) Members participated in meetings and tours in Oak Ridge with DOE, the National Park Service, Los Alamos, and Hanford representatives related to the Manhattan Project National Historical Park.
- (2) Members participated in the DOE's National Cleanup Workshop, with particular interest in sessions on risk-based end state concept, workforce development and succession planning, and replacement of aging infrastructure to support the DOE's EM mission.
- (3) ORRCA members held the organization's quarterly meeting on September 23<sup>rd</sup>. Agenda and minutes are posted on the website [www.orrca.org](http://www.orrca.org).
- (4) Member jurisdictions continued to monitor and review the studies and issues surrounding the proposed EMDF low level radioactive waste facility.
- (5) Members participated in the planning for the DOE's annual Intergovernmental meeting, led by the National Governor's Association.
- (6) Members reviewed proposed appropriations bills for FY2020, which contained funding for Oak Ridge DOE programs.
- (7) Member jurisdictions continued to monitor information pertaining to DOE's proposed interpretation of the high-level radioactive waste definition. This issue could have implications for waste disposal across the DOE complex.
- (8) Members participated in DOE's/TEMA's quarterly emergency response planning meetings.
- (9) Members reviewed progress and issues related to the State's monitoring of DOE activities, including environmental sampling and progress toward FFA milestones.

(10) Members prepared grant reports and financial statements to submit to the State of Tennessee in support of the ORRCA mission as described Tennessee Oversight Interlocal Agreement.

(11) Members participated in the review of the Section 106 process for the construction of the K-25 History Center.
